As of 12:00 p.m. on November 9, 2012, FEMA has designated New York City as a federal emergency site and is taking applications for disaster relief assistance. The agency is currently providing mobile walk-in centers in the affected area. The centers will have case workers available to assist individuals and families with their immediate needs. A center will provide assistance for basic needs and also provide referrals to community agencies that are providing services to disaster victims. Individuals may call or visit the website to search for Disaster Recovery Centers nearest to their location. In addition, grants and low-interest loans will be available for disaster victims.

Individuals can also apply for assistance online at <http://www.fema.gov> after an area has been designated as a federal emergency site. When applying, individuals will need to provide their Social Security number, home address, the address of the current location at which they are staying, proof of household income, and a description of items lost.
